Elevate

Elevate is an opportunity for 6th-12th graders to come together for fellowship, games, interactive activities and conversation surrounding meaningful topics. Throughout fall of 2020 Elevate focused on the struggles and injustices depicted in the Old Testament of the poor and displaced. Utilizing the knowledge gained from these conversations we were able to parallel the difficult situations our world is facing today in order to learn how we can be advocates for God's justice.

Summer Youth Camps

Central Mission Youth Ministries successfully hosted four youth camps during the Summer 2021 camping season at Lake Doniphan. More than 85 families received \$28,942.50 in camperships provided by Central USA Mission Center congregations. With a team of 65 incredible camp staff volunteers, we were able to serve a total of 179 campers. Collectively, our staff donated more than 5,256 hours of their time to ensure our campers had a safe, fun, meaningful, and Christcentered experience. The summer youth camp programs continue to be the leading ministry of Central Mission Youth Ministries. As a Mission Center, we are committed to ensuring their future success.

In Summer 2021 camp staff donated 5,256 hours of their time. Total onsite hours valued at \$20 per hour equates to \$105,120 worth of time donated to our Summer Youth Camp Programs.

Looking Toward the Future

Central Mission Youth Ministries remains devoted to serving our youth throughout our mission center. As we look towards the future, we are hopeful to engage and connect our youth in new and exciting ways. Plans for Elevate are in the works with a focus on exploring their relationship with Christ. The Central Mission Youth Council will resume meetings this fall, to continue developing and implementing strategies that will change the lives of our youth. Central Mission Youth Ministries continues to work with leaders throughout the United States to organize a National Community of Christ Youth Forum, providing space for church volunteers and leaders to share about youth ministry ideas, projects, and resources. To close out 2021 Central Mission Youth Ministries will host a Christmas retreat in December to provide an opportunity to come together in a sacred community to offer fellowship and discipleship formation.

OUTREACHING MINISTRIES

JAM

The Jesus and Me programs are created to share the love and story of Jesus Christ with the youth in our community. With a dedicated group of volunteers who have participated for approx. 20 years we serve around 150 kids each week. This program successfully reaches youth in all corners of Independence, MO.

Hawthorne Ministries

Hawthorne Place Apartments in Independence, MO is a ministry that evolves to meet the needs of those most vulnerable in our community. This ministry responds to the spiritual, emotion, and physical needs of the community. Examples of needs include: turkeys for Thanksgiving, prayer requests, and offering wellness checks during the COVID-19 Pandemic.

CSL Food Distribution

In May of 2020, Central USA Mission Center began partnering with Community Services League to provide a food distribution site for those in the community experiencing food insecurity due to economic hardship.

Boys and Girls Club of GKC

The partnership with the Boys and Girls Clubs of Greater Kansas City has remained vibrant through the COVID-19 Pandemic. Central USA Mission Center has continued to serve our neighbors by providing necessary resources and volunteers to support the education, health, and well-being of the youth in our community.

Coat Drive

The Central Mission Coat Drive primarily serves families in the Independence area. This ministry supports children and adults who are in need of warm clothes including coats, gloves, blankets, and hats to use while walking to school and commuting to work. In winter 2020, twenty-two volunteers gave their time and effort to provide dignity to our friends in need.
