A Letter from the Mission Center President Team

Dear Friends,

In Luke 4, Jesus stands in the synagogue, reads from the prophet Isaiah, and announces a mission centered on good news for the poor, release for the captives, recovery of sight for the blind, and freedom for the oppressed. This moment is more than the inauguration of Jesus' ministry; it declares what the kingdom of God looks like and who it is for. As disciples of Jesus Christ, we are called to embody that mission. Disciple formation begins when we allow Christ's mission to shape our identity, priorities, and how we live together.

Central USA Mission Center is working to organize itself faithfully around that calling. The church's purpose is not to maintain programs or preserve institutions, but to form people who are becoming like Christ and participating in Christ's mission. That means making intentional decisions about how we invest time, resources, leadership, and structures so we can nurture spiritual growth, strengthen congregations, and create space for new disciples and new expressions of ministry.

Yet we move forward with confidence that God is still at work among us, calling, shaping, sending, and renewing the church for the sake of the world.

Thank you for the many ways you continue to live Christ's mission through your generosity, service, and faithful witness. As you read this annual report, we hope you will see signs of God's Spirit at work across our Mission Center. Together, we are being invited deeply into the life and mission of Jesus, organizing not simply to survive, but to form disciples who bring God's peaceable reign closer in our time and place.

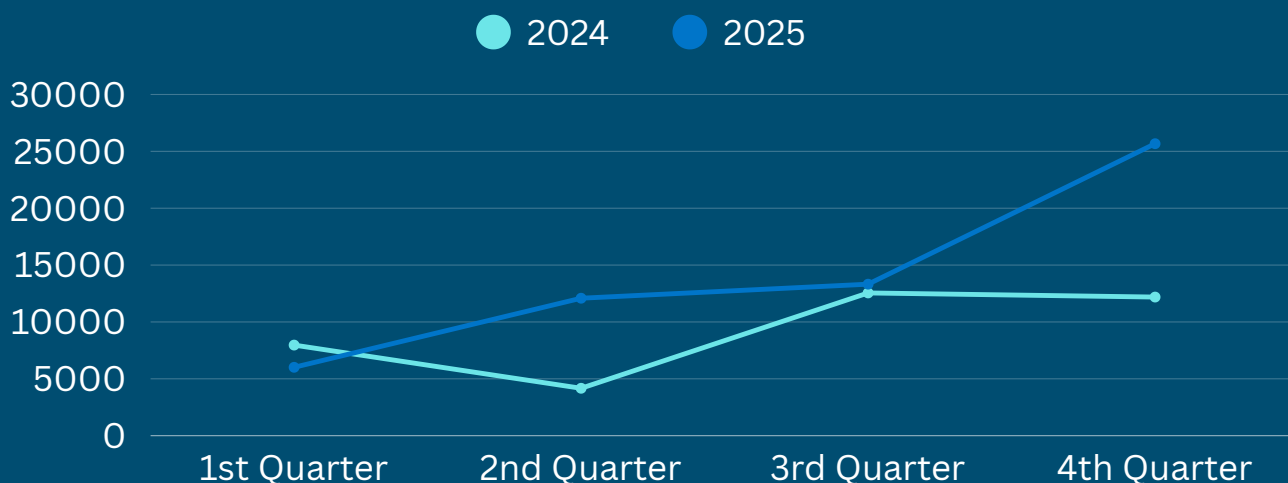

Quarterly Oblation Assistance



“Oblation assistance from Central Mission Center provided critical support to our family during a medical crisis. Our endowments and restricted funds support our mission by providing long-term income streams for ministry. Currently, Community of Christ utilizes a 4% spend rate on the 5-year rolling average of each account in order to preserve the portfolio's ability to combat inflation.

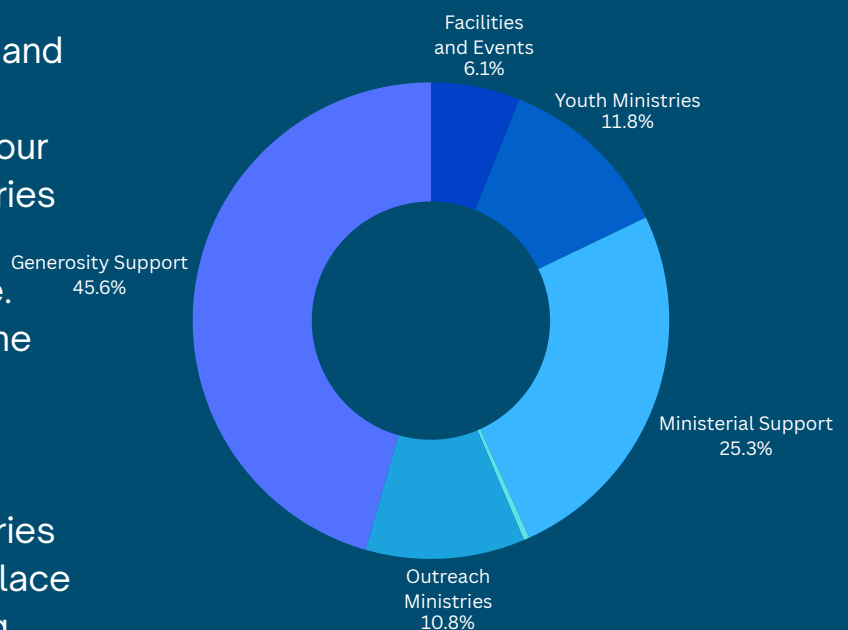
Budget Summary

To the left are the unaudited numbers for 2024 and the budgeted amounts for 2025. In 2025, the Mission Center saw congregational pledges decline slightly. Interest and other income – primarily from accounting services to affiliates – were projected to also remain about the same. For several years, a position on our accounting team remained unfilled causing lower than expected spending and surplus income. In 2025, the accounting role was filled which was expected to cause salary costs to grow to their previously planned amount. The mission center continues to look for cost savings and new forms of generosity to fulfill our mission to our area.

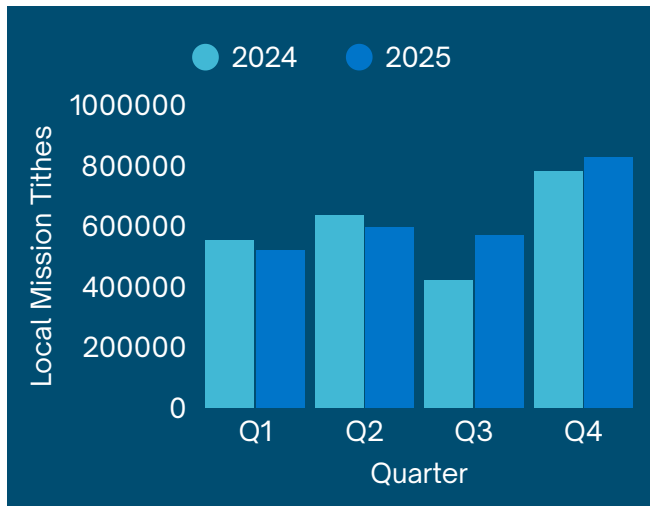
2025 Use of Funds

Our funds are primarily used to support four key areas:

- Supporting our congregations and regional programs with ministerial and administrative assistance.
- Providing accounting services for our congregations and regional ministries so that member's generosity is directed in the best ways possible.
- Offering youth ministries include the organizing of youth programs like Elevate and along with camps and retreats.
- Providing regional outreach ministries including our work at Hawthorne Place and young adults ministries among others.

Local Mission Tithes

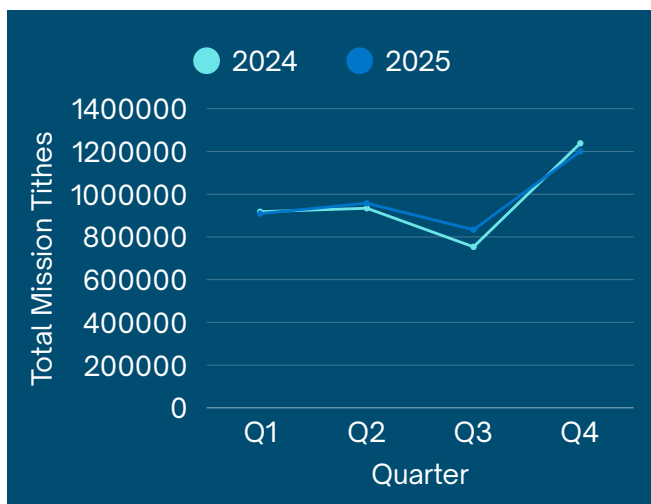
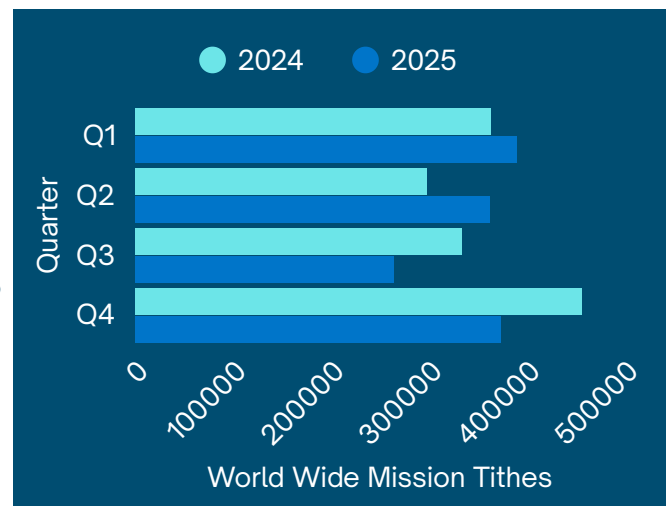
2024 vs. 2025
